Skill Development sessions on DATA, IM and ANALYSIS **(Non-technical: open to all humanitarian colleagues)**

An online learning series for humanitarian colleagues on safely obtaining, analysing and using data for analysis and response.

The three separate events will take place in 2022 and all Roster Members are invited to sign up. The lead facilitator is Daunia Pavone who has worked for more than 17 years with humanitarian information management, assessments, programmes and protection. The three sessions include:

1. **Foundations of Information Management and Analysis for Humanitarian Response** - *Learn the basics of IM and analysis and how to better work with IM colleagues towards Evidence-Based Decision-Making in a humanitarian response*
2. **Doing No Harm in Information Management and Analysis activities** - *Collecting, storing, analysing and sharing data can inadvertently do harm to the populations and our colleagues. What have we learned and what can we practically do to prevent harm?*
3. **Cooperation for Useful and Usable Data & Analysis: Working with DTM to get the data you need in displacement contexts** - *Learn how to engage with DTM, a key data provider in humanitarian responses, to get the data you need. Learn what information DTM can and cannot provide in displacement contexts, and where to find the rest. This session builds on the outcomes of Grand Bargain Needs Assessments Workstream and on the DTM & Partners cooperation approach.*
